Women's Bible Study

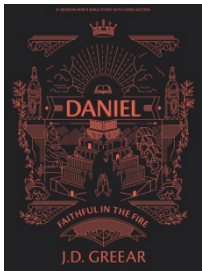

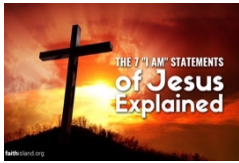

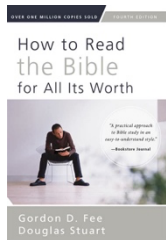

The Gospel of John features seven significant "I Am" statements made by Jesus. Each statement reveals a unique aspect of His identity and mission. These declarations are not merely metaphors; they assert Jesus' divine nature and connection to God. These statements link Jesus to the divine name revealed in Exodus 3:14, where God identifies Himself as "I AM." This connection underscores Jesus' authority and divinity, which often provoked strong reactions from religious leaders of His time. Each statement invites believers to engage with Jesus on a personal level, highlighting His role in their spiritual lives.

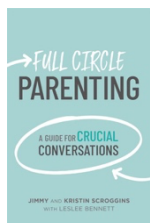
